1	3D Modeling and Design Supplies	\$15.00	To cover the cost of the 3D filament that is used to print projects students take home.	Students who do not pay will be able to participate in all class activities and create projects. However, students who do not pay will not be able to use the 3D printer.
1	Art 1 Supplies /Art 2 Supplies	\$20.00	To cover the cost of the students purchasing their own supply kit, including, but not limited to, colored pencils, pastels, paints, and specialty art paper. 1	Jewelry Supplies	\$20.00	To cover the cost of students purchasing their own expendable supplies for student projects, including but not limited to, metal, wood, stones, glass, fibers and wire.	Students who do not pay will not receive the supplies. Students can bring in their own supplies or will instead complete projects with scrap supplies.
1	Band and Orchestra Music Polo Shirt	\$16.50	To cover the cost of the students purchasing their own music polo shirt required to participate in performances.	Students who do not pay will not receive their own polo and will instead be provided with a recycled polo for performances. The polo must be returned after each performance.
1	Craft Supplies	\$20.00	To cover the cost of the students purchasing their own expendable supplies for student projects including, but not limited to, glass, ceramics, paper, and cloth.	Students who do not pay will not receive the supplies. Students can bring in their own supplies or will instead complete projects with scrap supplies.
1	Creative Foods/ International Cooking Lab Supplies	\$18.00	To cover all or a portion of the cost of purchasing food supplies for all students to use for cooking labs.	Students who do not pay will not participate hands on in the labs and will be given an educationally comparable assignment such as serving as a judge when applicable

1	Knitting Supplies	\$10.00	To cover the cost of the students purchasing their own knitting needles and expendable supplies including, but not limited to, yarn.	Students who do not pay will not receive or own the knitting needles or supplies. Students can bring in their own needles and supplies or will instead have access to classroom needles during school hours that cannot be taken off school grounds and will complete projects with scrap supplies.
1	Outdoor Living Supplies	\$10.00	To cover the cost of students purchasing their own expendable supplies used in outdoor living exercises including, but not limited to, fishing line and hooks, firewood, archery arrows, etc.	Students who do not pay will not participate hands-on in the associated activities and will instead either observe the activities or be provided an alternative role in the exercise.
1	Sew Creative	\$20.00	To cover the cost of students purchasing their own expendable supplies for projects including, but not limited to, thread, e-textiles, felt and Poly-Fil.	Students who do not pay will not receive the additional supplies and will instead only be provided with the basic supplies for projects. Students can bring their own additional supplies and/or use scraps.
1	Woods Crafts (Woodworking)	\$18.00	To cover the cost of students purchasing their own expendable supplies for student projects including, but not limited to, metal, lumber, stain, paint, saw blades and driver bits.	Students who do not pay will not receive the supplies. Students can bring in their own supplies or will instead complete projects with scrap supplies and cardboard.

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1	Robotics	\$20.00	To cover all or a portion of the cost of expendable supplies for student projects including but not limited to, batteries, LEGO®s and LEGO® parts and 3d filament.	Students who do not pay will not receive the supplies and will instead be provided with an educationally comparable alternative assignment such as completing a research paper on the project and/or working with school-supplied software and/or assisting in construction of class projects, utilizing alternative no-cost materials, including cardboard, shop scrap wood and upcycled materials and/or may provide their own materials as desired.
1	PE T-Shirt	\$5.00	To cover the cost of the students purchasing their own t-shirt required for PE.	Students who do not pay will not receive or own the t-shirt. Students can bring in a shirt from a previous year or will be provided with a recycled t-shirt. The t-shirt must be returned upon completion of the course.
1	Photography Supplies	\$20.00	To cover the cost of students purchasing their own expendable supplies for student projects including, but not limited to, ink, mounting boards, and photo paper.	Students who do not pay will be able to participate in all class activities and create projects. However, students who do not pay will not be able to print, mount and keep the projects.
1	Pottery Supplies	\$20.00	To cover the cost of students purchasing their own expendable supplies for student projects including, but not limited to, glaze and pottery.	Students who do not pay will be able to participate in all class activities and create projects. However, students who do not pay will not be able to glaze, fire and keep the projects, instead their projects will be recycled.
1	Teen Living Supplies	\$8.00	To cover the cost of the students purchasing their own expendable supplies including, but not limited to, additional food supplies for labs, supplies for crafts, and other consumables used in projects.	Students who do not pay will not receive the additional food supplies and will instead only use the basic supplies for cooking projects and will be provided with scraps to use for sewing and craft projects.

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1	WAVE Supplies	\$24.00	To cover the cost of the students purchasing their own expendable supplies for student projects including, but not limited to, electronic kits, soldering materials, 3D printing filament, paints and brushes, tape/glue/adhesives, construction supplies (lumber, hardware, etc.), publicity materials (stickers, fliers, etc.).	Students who do not pay will be able to participate in all class activities and assist in creating class projects. However, students who do not pay will not receive supplies to build their own projects to take home.
X	Assignment Notebook Replacement	\$6.00	To cover the cost of the students purchasing a replacement assignment notebook (includes parent/student book and schedule and is used as a hall pass.)	Students who do not pay will not receive a replacement copy of the notebook and will instead be provided with a photo copy as needed.

5	WAVE Club	\$40.00	To cover the cost of the students purchasing their own expendable supplies for student projects including, but not limited to, electronic kits, soldering materials, 3D printing filament, paints and brushes, tape/glue/adhesives, construction supplies (lumber, hardware, etc.) publicity materials (stickers, fliers, etc.) and a WAVE t-shirt.	Students who do not pay will be able to participate in all activities and assist in creating projects. However, students who do not pay will not receive supplies to build their own projects to take home or a WAVE t-shirt.

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
